

How you can find Beale Park from the Swan at Streatley (10 Minutes by car)

- Turn right exiting the Swan at Streatley and continue to the traffic lights making a left.
- Continue down this road (Reading Road) past Lower Basildon & Basildon Park until you meet a bridge with traffic lights. Once you have passed the traffic lights, about 200 yards on the left hand side is a slipway leading into Beale Park. Follow the slip road down and into the car park.

Basildon Park

Basildon Park is only a short distance away from the Swan at Streatley however, it is not in walking distance as it is situated along a main road with no footpaths. Basildon Park is a historical, elegant country mansion, which has been there since the 18th century. It has spectacular grounds and is owned by the National Trust. Basildon Park was the location for the film 'Pride & Prejudice' starring actress Keira Knightley. It was also the location for the film 'Marie – Antoinette'.

How to find Basildon Park from the Swan at Streatley (10 minutes by car)

- Turn right exiting The Swan at Streatley and continue to the traffic lights making a left. Continue down the main strip of road for a few miles until you come to Basildon Park's entrance on your right after leaving Lower Basildon, on the Reading Road.

Take a walk with the Swan at Streatley

Up the Hill (Up to 45 Minutes)

- Seasoned walkers not suitable for wheelchairs or pushchairs

- Turn right at the end of the road leaving the Hotel.
- Once at the traffic lights carry on up the narrow road next to the Bull on the right hand side and up the hill.
- Carry on up the hill and once at the top of the hill, turn right and into the car park entering the footpath.
- Once on top of the hill, you can see across the Oxfordshire & Berkshire countryside with views of the Thames which will take your breath away. You can continue this walk following the 'footpath' signs.
- The hill then bends slightly to the left, which will lead you through a gate and down the hill.
- Carry on to the bottom of the hill, and turn left up the lane. This will then lead you past
- Goring and Streatley Golf Club.
- Follow the sign into the golf club itself, being careful of any golf balls heading your way!
- Follow this by crossing two fairways, bearing in mind golfers driving across the course. The end of the footpath is clear once you have reached the top of the climbing hill, and enter the trees by the side of the golf Course, which will lead you back at the top of the hill and into the car park.

A Stroll beside the River Thames

-leisurely stroll with some steps

- From the Swan at Streatley Hotels' car park, continue towards the end of the car park until you reach the big 'A' sign, which is green and white.
- Once you reach this sign, turn left and then right, following the path.
- You will be able to carry on down this footpath as it leads you out beside the riverbank of the Thames.

You can continue down the footpath for miles, letting you enjoy the fresh air, breath taking scenery and peaceful atmosphere.

Goring & Streatley Village

Exiting the Swan at Streatley Hotel, take a left and continue to the end of the road.

Turn left and continue over the two bridges in which has the tranquillity of the River Thames flowing beneath them.

Once over the two bridges, you have entered Goring village that has many sights worth seeing and exploring.
